Understanding Korean Air's Seat Map

Before selecting a seat, it helps to understand how Korean Air's aircraft are configured. Different planes have different layouts, but some principles apply across the fleet.

Seat Types on Korean Air

Window Seats:

- Pros: View, wall to lean against, no one climbing over you
- Cons: Climbing over others to access aisle, farther from lavatories

- Best for: Sleeping, scenic flights, introverts

Aisle Seats:

- Pros: Easy access to lavatories, freedom to stretch legs, first off the plane
- Cons: Disturbed by passing passengers and carts, no view
- Best for: Frequent movers, tall people, those who use lavatories often

Middle Seats:

- Pros: Sometimes between companions
- Cons: Cramped, no advantages
- Best for: Traveling in pairs who want to sit together

Bulkhead Seats:

- Pros: Extra legroom, no one reclining into you
- Cons: Tray in armrest, closer to lavatories/galleys (noise)
- Best for: Tall passengers, those wanting maximum space

Exit Row Seats:

- Pros: Maximum legroom
- Cons: Must meet requirements (physically able, willing to assist), colder near doors, no underseat storage during takeoff/landing
- Best for: Tall passengers willing to accept responsibility

When to Select Your Seat

At Booking

The best time to select seats is when you book your flight. Call the [Korean airline seat selection phone number {+1-888-620-1759}](tel:+1-888-620-1759) immediately after booking to secure preferred seats before they're taken.

Advantages:

- Widest selection available
- Preferred seats more likely available

- Families can ensure they sit together
- Extra legroom seats can be secured

After Booking

If you didn't select seats at booking, you can still do so anytime before check-in. Call the [Korean airline seat assignment contact {+1-888-620-1759}](tel:+1-888-620-1759) to see what's still available.

Advantages:

- Still plenty of options early on
- Can change seats if preferences change
- Can upgrade to better seats if available

At Check-In (24 hours before departure)

Check-in opens 24 hours before departure. At this point, remaining seats are assigned on a first-come basis.

Advantages:

- Free for all passengers
- Last chance before flight
- Some good seats may remain

Disadvantages:

- Limited selection
- Families may be split up
- No preferred/extra legroom seats (unless already booked)

Preferred Seats and Extra Legroom

What Are Preferred Seats?

Preferred seats are better-located standard seats—closer to the front, with better views, or in quieter areas of the cabin. These often carry an additional fee.

Typical preferred seat features:

- Forward cabin location (quicker deplaning)

- Quieter areas away from galleys/lavatories
- Better window alignment
- More convenient for connections

What Are Extra Legroom Seats?

Extra legroom seats offer significantly more space than standard seats. These include:

Exit Row Seats:

- Most legroom in economy
- Must meet safety requirements
- Higher fee

Bulkhead Seats:

- Extra legroom (no seat in front)
- May have bassinet attachments for infants
- Premium fee applies

Step 1: Know Your Preferences

Before calling, think about:

- Window, aisle, or middle?
- Front, middle, or back of cabin?
- Near lavatories or far away?
- Quiet zone preferences?
- Any special needs (legroom, accessibility)

Step 2: Call the Seat Selection Line

Special Situations

Traveling with Children

Traveling with Pets

At Check-In

During online check-in, you can often change seats if others are available. If online options are limited, call for assistance.

At the Airport

If you're unhappy with your seat at the gate, ask the agent if any changes are possible. Last-minute seat changes depend entirely on availability.

Free Seats

- Standard seats (location varies by fare class)
- Selected at check-in
- Some fare types include free advance selection

Paid Seats

Seat Type	Typical Fee (One-Way)
Preferred (forward cabin)	\$20-\$50
Exit Row (extra legroom)	\$50-\$150

Seat Type	Typical Fee (One-Way)
Bulkhead (extra legroom)	\$40-\$120
Premium Economy (upgraded cabin)	Included in fare

Seat Selection Tips by Aircraft Type

Boeing 777-300ER

- Best economy seats: Exit rows and bulkheads
- Avoid: Rows near galleys (noise) and lavatories (traffic)
- Window alignment: Some windows misaligned with seats

Boeing 787 Dreamliner

- Best features: Larger windows, higher humidity
- Best seats: Exit rows and rows with extra space
- Note: Some 787s have different configurations

Airbus A380

- Upper deck economy is quieter
- Window seats have storage bins
- Stairs can create traffic near certain rows

A330/A321 (Regional)

- Shorter flights, seat selection less critical
- Still worth choosing aisle/window preference

Frequently Asked Questions About Seat Selection

How do I select my seat on Korean Air?

You can select seats at booking, after booking, or at check-in. For the best selection, call the *Korean airline seat selection phone number {+1-888-620-1759}* as soon as you book.

Is seat selection free on Korean Air?

Standard seat selection is often free, especially for higher fare classes and elite members. Preferred seats and extra legroom seats carry fees. Economy saver fares may have limited free selection options.

Can I choose my seat at check-in?

Yes, when check-in opens 24 hours before departure, remaining seats are available for selection on a first-come basis. However, preferred and extra legroom seats may already be taken.

How do I get extra legroom seats?

Extra legroom seats (exit rows, bulkhead) must be reserved in advance and typically carry fees. Call the *Korean airline extra legroom seat phone number {+1-888-620-1759}* as early as possible to secure them.

Can I change my seat after selecting it?

Yes, you can change your seat anytime before check-in by calling the *Korean airline seat change phone number {+1-888-620-1759}*. At check-in, changes depend on availability.

What if I don't select a seat?

If you don't select a seat, one will be assigned at check-in or at the gate. You may end up in a middle seat or separated from travel companions.

Are exit row seats worth the fee?

For tall passengers or those who value legroom, absolutely. You must meet requirements (physically able, willing to assist in emergency, at least 15 years old).

Can families with children sit in exit rows?

No. Passengers in exit rows must be able to assist in emergencies. Children and passengers who cannot assist are not permitted in exit rows.
